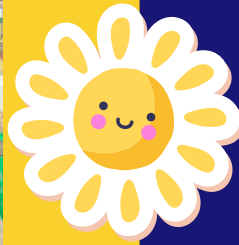
T.P.S visits Áras an Úachtaráin!
